Help us celebrate our 38th anniversary on **April 16th here at the Senior Center.**

Our History

1976: The Mason County Seniors Activities Association is formed.

The first home of MCSAA and its Center rented at the corner of 2nd and Cota Street.

1981: The MCSAA incorporates as a 501(c)(3)

Organization.

1985: The Center moves to the old Shelton Armory on Franklin and rents this space. (The building is later rented to S.O.C.K. and now owned by the Mason County Transit Authority.)

1986: MCSAA and the Skookum Rotary begin the fundraising campaign to buy the West Realty Building at Seventh and Franklin (the old Faith Lutheran Church) and convert it to a senior activity center.

1987: Fund-raising goals are met, the building at Seventh and Franklin is purchased, remodeled, and the new Mason County Senior Activities Center is opened that winter.

1988: Nifty Thrifty Store opens in Gateway Center. **1988**: Fundraising begins again to expand the Senior Center and later the decision is made to build a larger facility.

1991: MCSAA purchases the closing Sears Store at 9th and Railroad instead of building.

1992: After remodeling, MCSAA opens its new Senior Activities Center.

1996: MCSAA pays off the mortgage on the Mason

County Senior Activity Center.

2013: The Senior Center relocates to the larger Pavilion building at 190 W. Sentry Drive. The building at 826 W. Railroad Ave. then becomes the new larger home for the Nifty Thrifty Thrift Store.

2018: In April, we receive full property tax exemption. Newly created auxiliaries to the membership allows the Senior Center to move forward with more fundraisers. Other exciting changes are that we finished remodeling our restrooms to meet current ADA standards. We move office spaces, create doorways and open up more useful areas for our members to use for classes, eliminating underutilized spaces.

2019: We update our lights to LED fixtures and put in new water pressure tanks.

Assistance Dog Laws

Assistance Dogs in Public and in the community. Know the Law.



•As a business owner, employee, or other member of the community, there are some important things you should be aware of regarding

Assistance Dogs who have public access rights, as well as your rights

as a business.

Assistance dogs include Guide Dogs who are trained to help people who are visually impaired, Hearing Dogs who alert people who are deaf or hard of hearing, and Service Dogs who are trained to help people with mobility and other physical disabilities. Service Dogs

people with mobility and other physical disabilities. Service Dogs include Seizure Dogs and Autism Assistance Dogs.

•Therapy Dogs" and "Emotional Support Dogs" are NOT Assistance Dogs. They do not perform a physical skill.

Along with public access rights, the person and his/her dog have the following responsibilities:

* The dog must be well groomed, well behaved, under control, and trained for their task.

•* The dog must be on a leash.

* The dog must be able to lie quietly beside the handler without •blocking aisles or doorways

* The dog may NOT ride in a shopping cart or sit in a person's lap while at a restaurant.

State House Bill 2822 passed and changed many RCW's regarding service animals and Washington state will be imposing \$500 fines for misrepresentation of a service dog starting January 1, 2019.
