This letter is an explanation and an apology for all the mix-ups dealing with the determination of the status of the current vaccination policy

At the general members meeting held on May 17, 2022, there was a vote to determine whether the Association would or would not continue the current vaccination requirement to enter the Senior Center during normal business hours. There was a complaint lodged, that since this election wasn't announced before the meeting, there were not enough people present to represent their views on this subject.

I had heard this view in our Board Meeting, so I agreed to have another vote on the subject. After the meeting, I looked at our by-laws and there was no specific language prohibiting having a mail-in ballot. I took the concern about having as many members vote as possible and determined that we would mail out ballots that would be very difficult to copy or duplicate and asked for all the members to vote on the subject.

Immediately after mailing all these newsletters with the enclosed ballot, it was brought to my attention that a State of Washington law concerning Non-Profit organizations specifically states — "unless specifically approved in the by-laws, voting by ballot is prohibited."

So, this vote by ballot is not allowed under Washington State law.

I apologize for all the effort and expectations that went for naught.

I am asking for your forgiveness for my mistake.

More importantly, I am asking that ALL MEMBERS WHO HAVE AN INTEREST IN RETAINING OR REMOVING THE EXISTING VACCINATION POLICY, PLEASE COME TO THE GENERAL MEMBERS MEETING: AUGUST 16, 2022 AT 9:15 AM. THIS MEETING WILL BE HELD IN THE <u>GARDEN</u> TO ALLOW <u>ALL</u> CURRENT <u>VACCINATED AND UNVACCINATED MEMBERS</u> ATTENDANCE.

There will be a vote to address the status of this policy, and if the policy is removed, the vote will also determine that we will be following guidelines that are set by the CDC, the State of Washington, and the Mason County Health Department that require mandatory actions.

Again, please forgive my mistake of not looking at all the regulations before sending out the ballots. Respectfully:

# **Center Van Trips**

<u>POLICY:</u> Non-Members may go on most Center Van Trips provided they travel with a friend or family relation who is a current MCSAC member and pay the non-member price. Up to 2 guests per member. Advance payment is required to reserve your place. Costs are per person and include round trip van transportation, admissions, or ticket unless otherwise noted. Most require a minimum of eight people or it may be canceled. (Meals are not included unless listed.) Please note: Within two weeks of travel, there is a minimum \$5 fee for canceling or changing van trip dates. Within 3 business days, costs for van or casino trips are non-refundable and non-transferable. Exceptions may be possible due to illness. *All trips are scent free for consideration of participant allergies.* A few small purchases held on your lap are allowed on trip. Contact our manager Penny with questions or consideration due to illness. *Make your reservations early as all trips have minimum participant numbers to operate and are subject to cancellation if minimums aren't met. Masks and/or proof of vaccination may be required at some locations.* We do accept credit cards at trip sign up.
