



Nifty Thrifty is the major funding source of the Mason County Senior Activities Association. What many of you don't know is how we interact within our community. Nifty Thrifty accepts donations from our community and it's these items that we sell. We don't sell on consignment; we don't purchase and resell. The donations are local, and the funds go directly to the Senior Center.

Within our walls, the amount of work that it takes to operate a thrift store and insure we provide a safe, healthy and educational environment for our seniors often goes unseen. The majority of our work is done by volunteers. They are the hardest workers I've met and can't thank them enough. Without these kind folks we couldn't function and wouldn't have the business we have today.

During the year we ask our community to support us in many ways and it does! What you may not know are the ways we help our community. Day in and day out at Nifty Thrifty people wander in off the street and request help. We do what we can for them. Their needs vary from clothes to cookware. We give what we can. This year we've helped with two different families that lost their homes to fires by giving furniture, clothing and kitchen items. We give when asked.

We donate regularly to Turning Pointe, not only by taking clothing to them but also giving excess craft items. We contribute to the "Back to School Jamboree" where we offer half off on anything that a student can use for school. We donated to the Cold Shelter at the Transit Center, Community Lifeline, Northwest Resources and Crossroads Housing. Often when these charities have an individual in need, they call us and send their client over. Once at the store we try to fill their needs. As part of the community, we give what we can.

Our most recent donation was our older bus to the North Mason Fire District for their new Opiates Response Team. We donated our old, unused Bingo machine to the HUB Senior Center in Belfair. At the Senior Center we have a medical equipment bank. Our supplies are limited but we loan out various items when we can. We have our abundance table that usually has bread and other food free for our seniors.

We are proud of what we do. Being here for our members and our community makes us hold our heads high. We've been here for over thirty years and look forward to the next thirty and what we can do for our community. So when your see one of our volunteers busily helping out, make sure to thank them.



Assistance Dog Laws

Assistance Dogs in Public and in the community



•As a business owner, employee, or other member of the community, there are some important things you should be aware of regarding Assistance Dogs who have public access rights, as well as your rights as a business.

•Assistance dogs include Guide Dogs who are trained to help people who are visually impaired, Hearing Dogs who alert people who are deaf or hard of hearing, and Service Dogs who are trained to help people with mobility and other physical disabilities. Service Dogs include Seizure Dogs and Autism Assistance Dogs.

"Therapy Dogs" and "Emotional Support Dogs" are NOT Assistance Dogs. They do not perform a physical skill.

Along with public access rights, the person and his/her dog have the following responsibilities:

- The dog must be well groomed, well behaved and under control.
- * The dog must be on a leash.
- •* The dog must be able to lie quietly beside the handler without blocking aisles or doorways
- * The dog may NOT ride in a shopping cart or sit in a person's lap while at a restaurant.

State House Bill 2822 passed and changed many RCW's regarding service animals and Washington state will be imposing fines for misrepresentation of a service dog starting January 1, 2019.
