

<u>POLICY:</u> Non-Members may go on most Center Van Trips provided they travel with a friend or family relation who is a current MCSAA member and pay the non-member price. Up to 2 guests per member.

Advance payment is required to reserve your place. Costs are per person and include round trip van transportation, admissions, or ticket unless otherwise noted. Most require a minimum of eight people or it may be canceled. (Meals are not included unless listed.) Please note: Within two weeks of travel, there is a minimum \$5 fee for canceling or changing van trip dates. Within 3 business days, costs for van or casino trips are non-refundable and non-transferable. Exceptions may be possible due to illness. *All trips are scent free for consideration of participant allergies.* A few small purchases held on your lap are allowed on trip. 
Code of Conduct Reminder
